Notice of Intent to Update Several Recommended Practices

During the past year the NMRA DCC Working Group has been actively reviewing several topics to enhance DCC. These include Service Mode Decoder Lock, adding more functions, investigating a streaming mode protocol for updating the software in decoders, asymmetrical DCC, enhancements in DCC plugs, and enhancements to Bi-Directional DCC.

Two of these topics have reached the point where member comment is needed. These topics will result in proposed enhancements to RP-9.2.3, RP-9.3.1 and RP-9.3.2. These RPs are available for member comment on the Technical Department portion of the NMRA website or directly at www.dcc.info. To be consid-

ered, member comments must be received by June 15.

Topic 0307122—Service Mode Decoder Lock (update to RP-9.2.3).

As discussed in the January issue of *The Bulletin*, this proposal allows for a simple method for entry-level users to program decoders while the decoders remain on the main portion of the layout. The method involves a new instruction to tell decoders that are not to be changed to ignore the subsequent programming commands.

Topics 0309301 & 0309302—Update to Bi-Directional Transmission.

In 1993 the NMRA approved two new RPs to enable decoder-initiated data transmission. During

implementation several key enhancements were proposed in order to increase backwards compatibility, simplify the approach, and to increase the transmission speed in order to be able to transmit more data. These updates are included in a revised version of RP-9.3.1 and its companion Tech Note.

The updates to the transmission method specified in the revisions to RP-9.3.1 necessitated an update to the data protocol contained in RP-9.3.2. The new proposed data protocol allows for two windows to transmit data and increases the future expansion possibilities. The proposed revision is included in a revised version of RP-9.3.2.

Versions of the suggested improvements to all three RPs are now available for member comment.

New Modeler Award Added to National Contest

This year's national convention in Cincinnati will feature a contest just for beginners. The James L. Teese Memorial New Modeler Award will be presented to a first-time modeler earning the highest score among all first-time entrants in the judged contest. The award is sponsored by the Mid-Eastern Region.

The award recognizes Teese's contributions to the regional and national organizations. An accomplished modeler, he won awards at national and regional contests and was MMR #190. He was a well-respected contest judge who gave sound advice and encouragement to beginning modelers.

To be eligible for the Teese award a member must never have entered an NMRA-sponsored judged model contest at either the regional or national level, must be a current member of the NMRA and cannot be a professional model builder. The Mid-Eastern Region and its representative, or the national contest manager, will present the winner a plaque and a cash award of \$25.

If you're one of the many "kinda-afraid-to-enter-a-contest" modelers out there, you may want to take a look at this contest. And, yes, there really is a cash award along with a plaque! Remember the only requirement is that you fill out the NMRA Contest Entry Form and Judge's Scoring Sheet that are available at www.nmra.org website.

So build a model and keep notes of your progress—this helps when you fill out the paperwork. Include a photograph or two if you are deal-

ing with a prototype. You might also want to show how you made castings, fabricated parts and other items if these better explain how the model was built.

One last thing: if you wish to enter the model contest and cannot be in Cincinnati for the convention, you may submit your entry by proxy. Have a friend bring your model and paperwork to the contest room on Monday or Tuesday. Judging will take place for the national convention contest on Wednesday. Awards will be handed out on Thursday morning at our awards ceremony. If yours is the winning model it will be photographed and placed on the nmra.org website and perhaps make it into Scale Rails. Good luck!
